

## Legacy Trail Rules

- Trail opens at dawn and closes at dusk.
- No alcoholic beverages, controlled substances or concealed weapons permitted.
- Pets must be leashed and owners must remove all waste.
- Trash must be disposed of appropriately.
- Trail is open to walkers, bicyclists, joggers and skaters.
- No motorized vehicles allowed on Trail.
- No horses allowed on Trail.
- Please keep to the right and pass on the left.
- Please announce your intention to pass.
- Please move off Trail when stopped.
- Respect adjoining landowners' rights and privacy.

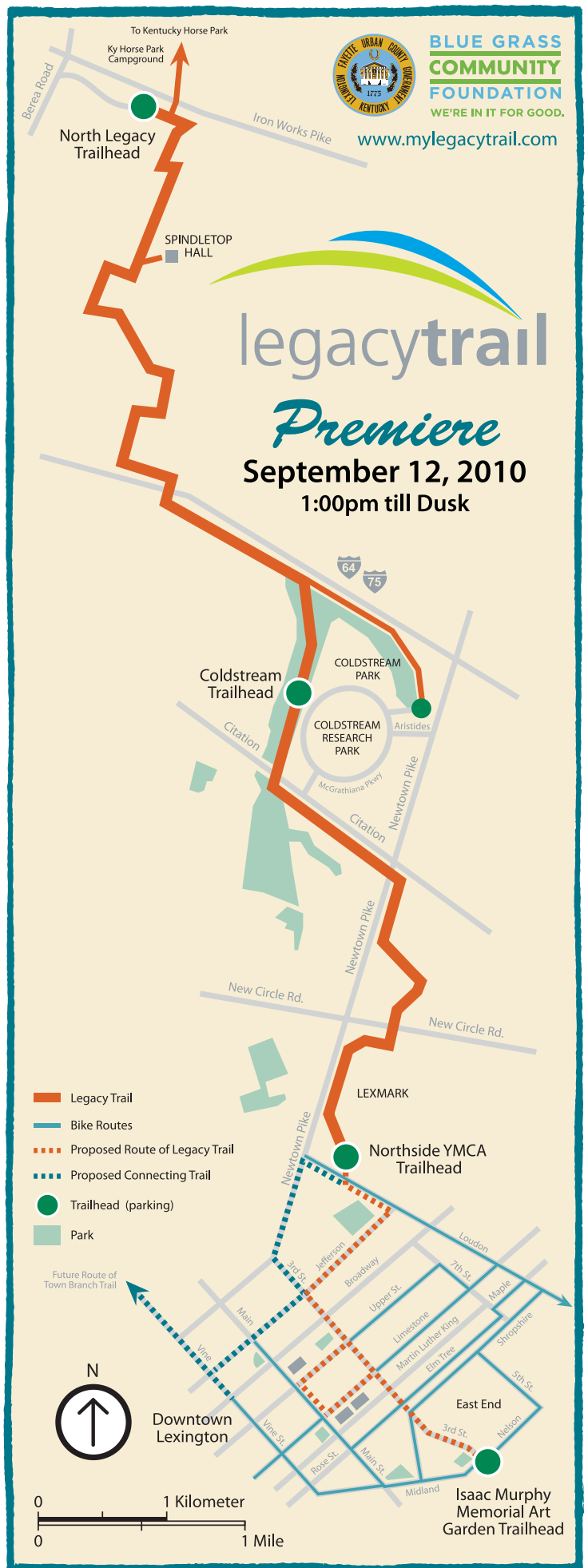

The Legacy Trail is a twelve-mile long paved walking and biking trail leading from the Isaac Murphy Memorial Art Garden in the East End, and other areas in downtown, to the Kentucky Horse Park. The Legacy Trail is a public art venue, a place to learn about our environment and our past, and a great way to simply get healthy and enjoy our beautiful countryside. Over eight miles are completed in the first phase.



This Trail is the result of a community-wide effort to identify projects that would become Legacies after the Alltech/FEI World Equestrian Games were over. The other Legacy Project is the revitalization of Lexington's historic East End.

This Trail is a reality thanks to the generosity of the property owners along the route, the diligent and dedicated work by the Lexington Fayette Urban County Government, the Commonwealth of Kentucky, scores of community volunteers, Blue Grass Community Foundation, and the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation.

## Opening Day Festivities

**Sunday, September 12, 2010** is the opening day for the Trail. The Trail will be open from 1:00 pm until dusk. The party will stretch the entire length of the Trail, including a Second Sunday bike ride from downtown and the Isaac Murphy Memorial Art Garden in Lexington's East End to the Kentucky Horse Park and back.

Feel free to plan your outing beginning at any point along the Trail – the North Lexington Family YMCA at 381 West Loudon Avenue, Coldstream Park off McGrathiana Avenue, or the North Legacy Trailhead at Ironworks Pike across from the Horse Park Campground. Pedicab service will be available at Coldstream Park, and Lextran buses will shuttle visitors between the Trailheads.



There will be a Family Fun Fest at the North Lexington Family YMCA. A dignitary-filled "shoelace" cutting and drawing to win a bike will be held at 3:00 PM at Coldstream Park. Trail information booths and water will be conveniently located.

Plenty of parking will ensure that getting to and on the Legacy Trail will be as easy as possible. This will also be a "Zero Waste" event. As you pack your picnic materials, we encourage you to bring things that are recyclable or reusable and ask that you recycle by placing all your materials in recycling bins located at the Trailheads.
